February 2024

Survey conducted February 5 through February 6, 2024. 858 likely General Election voters participated in the survey. Survey weighted to match expected turnout demographics for the General Election. Margin of Error is +/-3.3% with a 95% level of confidence. Totals do not always equal 100% due to rounding.

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Q1: Do you approve or disapprove of Joe Biden's job performance as President?

Approve: 33%
Disapprove: 62%
Unsure: 5%

Q2: Do you approve or disapprove of Andy Beshear's job performance as Governor of Kentucky?

Approve: 55%
Disapprove: 30%
Unsure: 15%

Q3: Did you vote in the 2020 presidential election?

Yes: 96%
No: 2% (GO TO Q5)
Unsure: 2%

Q4: Did you vote for Donald Trump, Joe Biden, or someone else in the 2020 Presidential Election?

Donald Trump: 60%
Joe Biden: 33%
Someone Else: 3%
Unsure: 4%

Q5: Do you believe that only U.S. citizens should be able to vote in Kentucky elections? Or, do you believe that non-citizens should also have the right to vote in some Kentucky elections?

Only US citizens should be able to vote in Kentucky elections: 90%

Q6: With the federal government acknowledging that 5 million migrants crossed the U.S. border last year—either illegally or seeking refugee status—how concerned are you about the border and the flow of migrants?

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Q7: In 2021, the New York City Council passed a law allowing non-citizens to vote in all city elections, a population of about 800,000. In 2022, Washington, DC's Council likewise gave non-citizens the vote, even those in the country illegally. San Francisco and Oakland also allow non-citizens who are here illegally to cast a vote. Do you see this trend more as an expansion of voting rights or an undermining of election integrity?

Q8: A law professor at the University of Kentucky recently tweeted that, "Technically, the current [state] constitution might allow a locality to pass a law that lets non-citizens vote in local elections. That's what happened in places in California, Maryland, and others." Considering this, how concerned are you that a city in Kentucky might allow non-citizens to vote?

Q9: A state constitutional amendment has been introduced in the Kentucky Legislature that would clarify that only citizens of the United States are eligible to vote in all state and local Kentucky elections. If two-thirds of both houses of the legislature approve the measure, called the Kentucky Citizen-Only Voting Amendment, it will appear on the ballot for voters to decide this November. Do you support or oppose this amendment?

Strongly support: 64%
Somewhat support: 11%
Somewhat oppose: 3%
Strongly oppose: 6%
Undecided: 16%

Q10: The Kentucky Citizen-Only Voting Amendment has already passed the State House of Representatives by a vote of 81 to 15. It now goes to the State Senate, where if it passes it will go on the November ballot. If you learned that your legislator voted AGAINST this amendment, would you be more or less likely to vote against re-electing your legislator, or would it make no difference?
