Survey conducted May 17 through May 19, 2024. 619 likely 2024 General Election voters participated in the survey. Survey weighted to match expected turnout demographics for the 2024 General Election.

Margin of Error is +/-4.1% with a 95% level of confidence. Totals do not always equal 100% due to rounding.

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Q1: Generally speaking, do you believe the state of Oklahoma is headed in the right direction, or is it going off on the wrong track?

Right direction: 40%

Wrong track: 37%

Not sure: 23%

Q2: Would you say you strongly approve, somewhat approve, somewhat disapprove, or strongly disapprove of Joe Biden's job performance as President?

Strongly approve: 22%

Somewhat approve: 14%
