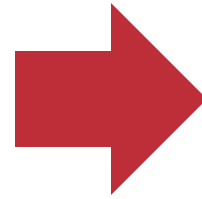


IOWA VOTE FOR THE REFERENDUM ON THE BACK OF YOUR BALLOT



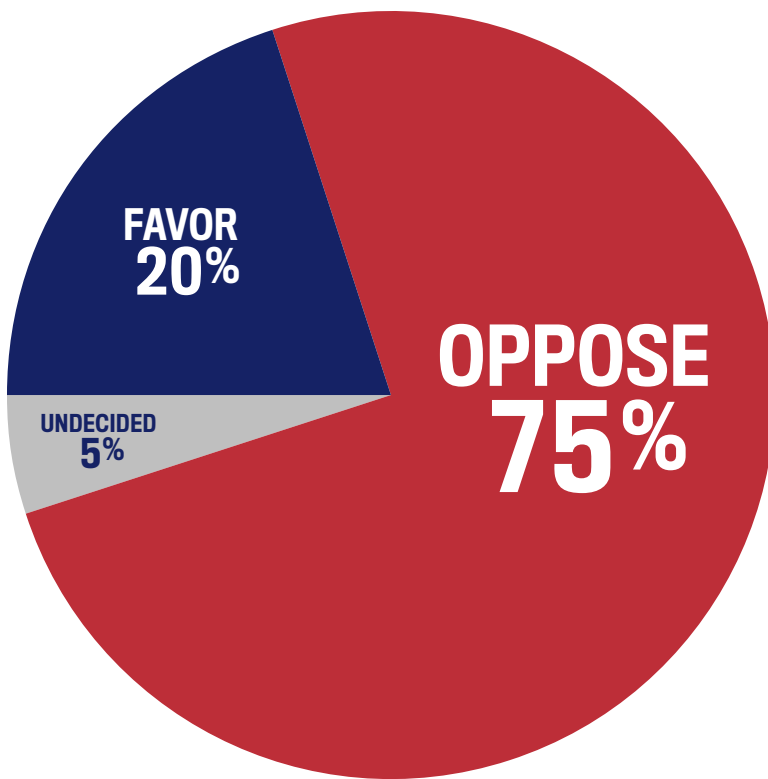
Shall the following amendment to the Constitution be adopted?

Constitutional Amendment 1

Full Text: Section 1 of Article II of the Constitution of the State of Iowa, as amended by the amendment of 1970, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof: Section 1. Electors. Only a citizen of the United States of the age of eighteen years, who shall have been a resident of this state for such period of time as shall be provided by law and of the county in which the citizen claims the citizen's vote for such period of time as shall be provided by law, shall be entitled to vote at all elections which are authorized by law. However, for purposes of a primary election, a United States citizen must be at least eighteen years of age as of the next general election following the primary election. The required periods of residence shall not exceed six months in this state and sixty days in the county.

OF NATIONWIDE VOTERS OPPOSE NON-CITIZEN VOTING

The survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted for ACV on March 9-10, 2023. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by gender, age, and race. The margin of sampling error for the full sample is ± 3.1 percentage points.
